## **Global Mission Ministry**

In 2008, the Global Mission Ministry continued the approach established in 2004 of giving with a consideration to personal ties and contacts between the recipients and Saint Mark, be it individual congregants, the church staff, or extended networks of friends and families. We continue to work to strengthen mission partnerships with some of the recipient groups to include direct sharing of work and spiritual growth experiences.

## Highlights from 2008

<u>A Water Well for Tchekos, Cameroon:</u> We will be working to help fund and find a way to have a well for clean drinking water constructed in Tchekos, Cameroon. There is currently no well for water in Tchekos. The people have to walk two (2) miles to get water and carry it back in various containers on their heads. Tchekos (pronounced "check os") is a village of about 2,000 people in the Center province of Cameroon, about 80 miles from the capital, Yaoundé. It is one of many small, rural villages in Cameroon and the home village of Battokok Bityeki. Battokok and his wife, Julienne, have been members of Saint Mark since 1986. We hope to bring clean drinking water to this village.

Saint Mark's relationship with Tchekos dates back to 1990. We have been supporting the Tchekos Dispensary, a health care facility operated by the Presbyterian Church in Cameroon, (known by its French initials: EPC (Eglise Prebyterienne Camerounaise). Pastor Roy and others visited Tchekos in 2001.

<u>Equal Exchange Fair Trade Products:</u> We continued to sell Equal Exchange fairly traded products to Saint Markers and their friends. The sale of these products helps farmers in some of the poorest areas in the world earn a living wage, learn environmentally sustainable techniques, and develop community cooperatives that build local schools and clinics. In addition, the Presbyterian Small Farms project benefits from each order we submit.

<u>Bread for the World:</u> Saint Mark continued its giving as a Covenant Church with the Bread for the World (BFW) organization. Saint Mark pledges an annual donation to BFW to be used in the fight to end global hunger. Under the leadership of Saint Marker Sandy Champion, who is the Hunger Action Enabler for the NCP, Saint Mark again participated in the "Offering of Letters".

Mission Visit with St Joseph's Family Representative: We had the honor of spending an evening with the Director of St Joseph's Home for Boys, an orphanage in Haiti, to hear about this ministry

in Haiti, one of the most impoverished countries in the world. It was an opportunity to feel and witness first-hand the strength that comes from being part of a global community in faith.
